

Site investigations

Queensland Tennis Centre, Tennyson

The Games Independent Infrastructure and Coordination Authority (GIICA) is laying the foundations for the world's biggest event in 2032.

We are responsible for delivering 17 new and upgraded venues across Queensland jointly funded by the Australian and Queensland Governments ahead of the Brisbane 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

Queensland Tennis Centre's proposed upgrade includes a new 3,000-seat show court and up to 12 new courts, adding to the current 22 match and training courts.

The upgrade recognises Queensland's proud tennis history and will provide long-term economic, community and high-performance benefits well beyond the 2032 Games.

Site investigations

Site investigations are needed to better understand ground conditions at the Queensland Tennis Centre, to inform design and planning.

What to expect

Site investigations are expected to commence from **mid-July and continue for several weeks** on the site of the Queensland Tennis Centre.

Works will take place within the site, mostly outside existing courts and facilities to minimise impact of users.

The works and activity will include:

- installation of temporary barricades around test sites
- truck based borehole drilling
- soil testing
- aerial surveying (using a drone) and cultural survey activities
- signage installed to assist the public navigate temporary impacts
- additional heavy vehicle movements on King Arthur Terrace, Tennyson.

Work hours

Activities will be undertaken within standard work hours of 6.30am and 6.30pm, Monday to Friday. Additional notification will be provided ahead of any work outside these hours including weekend or night work.

All work is subject to relevant approvals, weather and construction conditions. The Queensland Tennis Centre will remain operational during these works.

GIICA is committed to minimising the impact or disruption caused by construction activities on the surrounding community as far as possible.
